







Whom they received previous treatment from:



State of health for patients who DID use ambulance:













Accessing an ambulance

29 people gave feedback on waiting for an ambulance








Experience of paramedics

Most people had a very good experience of paramedics




Behavior of paramedics:






40% of patients received pain relief:







